## Explanations:

1. **The TDB, however, will provide all possible facilities for women devotees which will reach the shrine from October 16.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but it has a grammatical error regarding use of 'which'. "Which" is used for non-living things, whereas here it is used for female devotees which represents a class of living-beings. Thus instead of 'which', use of "who" is preferred. Correct sentence – **The TDB, however, will provide all possible facilities for women devotees *who* will reach the shrine from October 16.**

**It will be very difficult and challenging to the Board to provide any special amenities for devotees in the present context.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but grammatically wrong preposition is being used over here. The phrase should be reframed as "for the Board" instead of 'to the board'. Board is the authority that will provide amenities to the devotees, thus this will be a challenge for the board. Thus the correct sentence is – **It will be very difficult and challenging *for* the Board to provide any special amenities for devotees in the present context.**

**During the last annual pilgrim season, devotees had to stand in the queue for over 17 continuous hours on a particular day.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

Therefore only C-D makes valid combination.

Hence option C is correct.

2. Connectors:

B and F:

B: The insurance sector should also understand

F: **The air violation was noted around 12.10 p.m. or it was committed by a Pakistani helicopter in the Poonch sector.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but it has a grammatical error regarding use of 'or'. "or" is used to define a choice between two related things but the circumstances are entirely different to each other. One talks about the time of incidence and another describes the doer of incidence. Correct sentence – **The air violation was noted around 12.10 p.m. and it was committed by a Pakistani helicopter in the Poonch sector.**

**The Pakistani military helicopter flew for nearly five minutes within 250 m of the LoC and hovered over the Gulpur sector before turned back.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but grammatically wrong form of verb is being used over here. The phrase should be reframed as "turning back" instead of 'turned back'. Thus the correct sentence is – **The Pakistani military helicopter flew for nearly five minutes within 250 m of the LoC and hovered over the Gulpur sector before *turningback*.**

**The incident comes a day after the Indian and the Pakistani troops exchanged fire on the LoC in north Kashmir's Kupwara district.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

Therefore only C-D makes valid combination.

Hence option A is correct.

**3. Major decisions in the court continues to take cover behind legal technicalities.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but it has a grammatical error regarding use of verb. Here subject is plural (decisions) thus the verb should also be plural i.e. continue rather than continues. Correct sentence – **Major decisions in the court *continue* to take cover behind legal technicalities.**

**Triple talaq is against the basic tenets of the Holy Quran, and consequently, it violates Shariat.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**The court has not shied away from confronting age-old personal law practices, usages and customs which were considered taboo.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

Therefore B-E and C-D make valid combination.

Hence option D is correct.

**4. Our car moved forward and collided with the wall of an underpass.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**The victim was dropping his colleague Sana Khan home when the incident take place.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually correct but it has a grammatical error of wrong tense. The sentence is in past tense , thus instead of take, its second form "took" is correct to be used here. Correct sentence – **The victim was dropping his colleague Sana Khan home when the incident *took* place.**

**Prima facie the guilty have been arrested and if needed, the case will also be sent to SBI.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

Therefore C-E and A-F make valid combination.

Hence option B is correct.



**5. Even after they got back home after the rescue operation, Jineesh and group were in constant touch with those rescued, over phone.**

Fragment A of column 1 is matched with fragment E of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**The irony is, his name does not even appear in the official list of rescuers.**

Fragment B of column 1 is matched with fragment F of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

**Jineesh had given up on his studies after completing Plus Two, to take up fishing and support his two younger brothers.**

Fragment C of column 1 is matched with fragment D of column 2 to make the sentence contextually and grammatically correct.

Therefore A-E , B-F and C-D make valid combination.

Hence option B is correct.

**6. A-F:**

These two fragments can be combined together in order to make a sentence that will be both grammatically and contextually correct. There will not be any error in the combined sentence.

**The combined sentence would be:** The Reserve Bank of India has been given the task of keeping the inflation under check.

**C-E:**

These two fragments can be combined in order to make a meaningful sentence but the combined sentence will not be grammatically correct. In fragment E, *supporting* is not the correct word, rather *support* should have been used in this context to make it grammatically correct.

**The correct sentence after combining the two fragments would be:** It is not possible to do this without **your support**, both mentally and financially.

The pair left will not make it meaningful if the fragments are combined and the sentence thus formed will not be correct grammatically and contextually.

This will make option C the correct choice among the given options.

**7. A-E:**

These two fragments can be connected together in order to make a sentence that will be grammatically and contextually correct. No correction will be required to be carried out in the combined sentence so formed.

**The combined sentence would be:** The new president of the company wants to make sure that all the employees are given their rightful dues within time.

**B-F:**

These two fragments can also be combined in order to form a sentence that will be meaningful and contextually correct. There will not be any grammatical error in the sentence so formed.

**The combined sentence would be:** The labour laws of the country need to be amended in order to make them more relevant to the present scenario.

**C-D:**

These two fragments will make a meaningful and contextually correct sentence when combined together. There will not be any grammatical error also in that new statement.

**The combined sentence will be:**

The agriculture sector of India is going through a very tough time since the government is not sure about the due course of action for ensuring growth in this sector.

This makes option B the correct choice among the given options.

**8.** None of the given pairs can be connected together in order to frame sentences that will be meaningful and contextual. C and D have something common but they will not make a grammatically correct sentence if combined together. There is no such relation between the other pairs to even consider pairing them together to form meaningful sentences.

This makes option E the correct choice among the given options.

**9. A-E:**

These two sentences can be combined together in order to form a grammatically and contextually correct sentence. However, there will be grammatical error in that combined sentence. 'Tracking' is not correct in this context and instead of this, *track* should be used in this context as it implies keeping a tab on something.

**The correct combined sentence would be:**

The Right to Privacy should be honoured by the search engines by not **keeping track** of the information pertaining to the users.

**B-F:**

These two fragments can be combined in order to form a sentence that will be meaningful and also contextually correct. There will also be no grammatical error in the new sentence thus combined.

**The combined sentence would be:**

It is often observed that the political bosses control the bureaucrats in our country.

**C-D:**

These two fragments can be combined together in order to form a meaningful statement that will also be contextually correct. However, there will be grammatical error in the combined sentence thus formed. Fragment D wants to imply the actions of somebody and it is denoted by *deeds*.

**The correct combined sentence would be:**

There is no valid reason to justify his **deeds** yesterday in the class.

This makes option D the correct choice among the given options.

- 10.** None of the given pairs can be combined together in order to form meaningful and contextually correct sentences. Some of the fragments talk about similar or related topics but if combined, they will not be grammatically correct. For example, it may seem that B and E are talking about the securities market of the country but these fragments cannot be combined to form something meaningful and grammatically correct. Same can be commented regarding C and F.

Therefore, none of the given options is correct and also there is no pair which is making sense as a meaningful and contextually correct statement if combined together.

Hence, option E is the correct choice among the given options.



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
