Explanations:

1.

Corrects the misuse of phrasal verb for noun. 'Breakout' is a phrasal verb meaning 'to start or appear suddenly' while 'out break' is a noun meaning 'sudden appearance'. A preposition or an article is used before a noun, not a verb. Use preposition 'before' in place of 'for' because a preventive measure is taken before the appearance of epidemic.

Hence, the option D is correct.

2.

Corrects prepositional error and error of pronoun. 'Her' refers to 'woman' (singular). Contingent should be followed by preposition on/upon meaning dependent on/upon.

Hence, the option A is correct.

3.

Delete preposition 'to' after resemble'. Hence, the option B is correct.

4.

Corrects the error of number and tense. Adjective 'every' should be followed by singular noun (aspect), while the verb 'will' should be 'would' to agree with the tense of the verb of principal clause (assured).

Hence, the option D is correct.

5.

Corrects the error of number and comparison by means of superlative degree. 'Cattle' is always used as plural noun, it does take 's' or 'es' at end. While comparing by means of superlative, the latter term should include the former. So, delete the use of 'other' because, it excludes the former term (India).

Hence, the option D is correct.

6.

Because the train is scheduled to arrive at 12 PM ('at' should be used to express point of time).

Hence, the option B is correct.

7.

Corrects the error of use of preposition. Because the custom is prevalent among muslims and it is practised by them, so use of possessive case is correct, because voices against this practice are being raised by women's organisations or organisation of women. The Question Bank

Hence, the option A is correct.

8.

Corrects the error of preposition. 'But' excludes while 'besides' includes. 'But' is used after negative no body, and none meaning 'except'. While 'besides' means 'in addition to'.

Hence, the option D is correct.

9.

'Confined' is followed by preposition 'to'. Hence, the option A is correct.

10.

'hardly' is followed by 'when'. Hence, the option B is correct.
