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Explanation:

1. The above sentence is erroneous. The usage of the preposition 'by' violates the standard rules of grammar. The verb 'imposed' is always followed by 'on'.

Correct Sentence:

I am going to the Supreme Court registry to **deposit Re 1 fine imposed on me.**

Hence, the correct answer is B.

2. The sentence wrongly uses the word 'farther'. It should be replaced by 'further'. The sentence wants to convey that the dispute became more bitter which is understood by 'further'.

Further- defined as something that is additional or more

Farther- means "more distant."

Correct sentence:

The dispute of India and China **was further aggravated by the current standoff.**

Hence, the correct answer is option A.

3. The above statement tests you on Adjectives. The sentence includes comparison of profits of Maruti and Toyota for that purpose option A captures it appropriately by putting pronoun 'that' which refers to profits.

Correct sentence:

The profits of Maruti **are more than that of Toyota** for this quarter

Hence, the correct answer is option A.



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4. The above statement contains an error with the use of phrase 'wave a false story by'. We do not 'wave a false story' but 'weave' it which means 'making up lies about something'.

Correct sentence:

The media is **trying to weave a false story by** itself based on the recent developments.

Hence, the correct answer is option C.

5. The sentence tests you on the knowledge of tenses. The fragment 'last two months' is in the past form which tells us that the sentence must be of past tense but 'is being' violates it as it is Present continuous form of tense.

Correct sentence:

He **had been interrogated twice** in the last two months for his alleged role.

Hence, the correct answer is option A.

6. The above sentence omits the use of 'as' after seen. Option B rightly mentions it.

Correct sentence:

These macho misfits might **still be seen as the** epitome of screen rebellion.

Hence, the correct answer is option B.

7. The above sentence uses 'bringed' which does not exist in English. The past form of 'bring' is 'brought'. The above sentence can use any of 'brought' or 'brings' in the place of 'bringed'.

Correct sentence:

Dubai's annual design event **brings together unique** heritage crafts with a world view.

Hence, the correct answer is option B.

8. The sentence is absolutely correct and contains no error.

Correct sentence:

This year these have **largely been inspired** by the region's history and traditions.

Hence, the correct answer is option E.

9. The above sentence is completely correct and need not be corrected.

Correct sentence:

I want **to look close up at** regional activity through the work-in-progress of local designers and craftsmen.

Hence, the correct answer is option E.

10. The above sentence talks about population and its actions. Here, thrive is the action performed by 'population' which is singular noun case and hence the verb 'thrive' must also be used in agreement with it, i.e., 'thrives'.

Correct sentence:

The population not only accepts change, **but thrives on it.**

Hence, the correct answer is option C.



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
