Explanations:

1.

We use in order to with an infinitive form of a verb to express the purpose of something. It introduces a subordinate clause. It is more common in writing than in speaking.

[Main clause]

Mrs Sharma had to work full-time

[subordinate clause]

in order to earn a living for herself and her family of five children.

Ex. We all need stress in order to achieve and do our best work.

We, thus, need to replace the underlined part with 'in order to become' to make it a grammatically correct sentence. The Question Bank

Hence, the option B is correct.

2.

The sentence requires no correction as it is absolutely correct. Hence, the option E is correct.

3.

Correct the error of correlative conjunction. 'No sooner ... than' expresses a negative sense, and for emphasis, it is placed first in the sentence or the clause and are then followed by an inverted form of the verb. In such case it acts as a adverb phrase. No sooner had he been than.

Hence, the option D is correct.

4.

Corrects the error of agreement. Because, 'all this' conveys 'one idea', so it should be treated as singular.

Hence, the option B is correct.

5.

Corrects the error of parallel structure of gerund and use of definite article before 'women'.

Hence, the option D is correct..

6.

Corrects the prepositional error and error of plural number. Because in the given sentence, use of plural number (delays and formalities) is more appropriate as they show normal feature of the system.

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Hence, the option A is correct.

7.

Corrects the use of 'little'. According to sentence, foreign minister's line is that India has nothing to lose by signing the treaty. So little should be used instead of 'a little' to express the meaning.

Hence, the option B is correct.

8.

Corrects the error of definite article and gerund followed by preposition. In the sentence, no particular interest rate is being talked of. So 'the' is superfluous before interest. 'Interest' is followed by preposition 'in' and there after verb + ing (gerund). Hence, the option C is correct.

9.

The sentence is correct.

Attend (verb):

If you attend to something, you deal with it. If you attend to someone who is hurt or injured, you care for them.

Ex. The staff will helpfully attend to your needs.
Ex. The main thing is to attend to the injured.
Thousand (a num noun):
A thousand or one thousand is the number 1,000.
Ex. ...five thousand acres...
Ex. Visitors can expect to pay about a thousand pounds a day.
Hence, the option E is correct.

10.

Corrects the error of sub-verb agreement and preposition. The subject for the verb 'increases' (singular) is 'their vulnerability' conveying one idea (singular). Preposition 'to' is used after vulnerability.

Hence, option C is correct.
