Who: 10 Hafte 10 Baje 10 Minute: Dengue drive

What: resumes today in Delhi

When: published on 6th September 2020

Delhi government is going to relaunch its anti-dengue campaign—10 Hafte 10 Baje 10 Minute—on Sunday under which an extensive awareness campaign against dengue and chikungunya will be carried out for 10 weeks. Soon after the outbreak of monsoon season, cases of vector-borne diseases start rising and timely action plan is required to keep them under control.

The first 10-week-long anti-dengue campaign was launched last year, which substantially reduced the number of dengue cases and only two deaths were reported.



Chief minister Arvind Kejriwal will kickstart the campaign on Sunday (September 6) by inspecting his own residence for stagnant clean water. He will inspect his house for 10 minutes for 10 weeks at 10am. (Read more)

The JMA numbers typhoons in Japan and the first typhoon to occur after January 1st of the year is called typhoon number 1. While in the US, hurricanes are referred to by English names, the intergovernmental organisation called the Typhoon Committee (Cambodia, China, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Hong Kong, Japan; Lao People's Democratic Republic, Macao, China, Malaysia, the Philippines, Republic of Korea, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam and the United States of America), which has 14 members including Japan uses Asian names for typhoons that are contributed by the member countries. Haishen was a name recommended by China and means "sea god" in Chinese. (Read More)

The species has been named Pothos boyceanus after Peter C. Boyce, an expert on Araceae of southeast Asia. The species was discovered by G. Rajkumar, Nazarudeen Ahammed, T. Shaju, and R. What: have finalised a major deal for manufacturing AK-47 203 rifles in India

When: published on 3rd September 2020

India and Russia have finalised a major deal for manufacturing AK-47 203 rifles in India during Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's ongoing visit here, the official Russian media reported on Thursday.

The AK-47 203 is the latest and most advanced version of the AK-47 rifle, which will replace the Indian Small Arms System (INSAS) 5.56x45 mm assault rifle.

The Indian Army has a requirement for around 770,000 AK-47 203 rifles, of which 100,000 will be imported and the rest will be manufactured in India, Russia's state-run Sputnik news agency said.

The rifles will be manufactured in India as part of the joint venture Indo-Russia Rifles Private Limited (IRRPL), established between the Ordnance Factory Board (OFB), the Kalashnikov Concern and Rosoboronexport—the Russian state agency for military exports, it said. (Read more)

What: successfully test scramjet technology for hypersonic missiles

When: published on 8th September 2020



India on Monday successfully tested an indigenously-developed hypersonic technology demonstrator vehicle (HSTDV) powered by a scramjet engine, which will serve as a critical building block for nextgeneration hypersonic cruise missiles.

The HSTDV test, conducted from the Dr Abdul Kalam Island off the Odisha coast at 11.03 am to demonstrate the autonomous flight of a scramjet integrated vehicle, propelled India right into an

extremely exclusive hypersonic club consisting of the US, Russia and China as of now. (Read more)

Who: Indian scientists

What: develop machine learning-based practical approach for automatic interpretation of 3D seismic

When: published on 5th September 2020

Scientists struggling with the manual interpretation of growing seismic data to explore causes of earthquakes, particularly when the area is geologically complex, are now armed with a machine learning-based solution that can help in automatic interpretation of this data. Scientists from Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology (WIHG), an autonomous Institute under the Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, have developed a neural-based (machine learning-based) practical approach for automatic interpretation of 3D seismic data. This first of its kind approach has been

developed by computing a new attribute called meta-attribute.

The tabular sheet intrusions between older layers of sedimentary rock or beds of volcanic lava (sill complexes) significantly contribute to the transport and storage of hot magma, and leading to overburden. This acts as plausible structural traps for hydrocarbon accumulations in sedimentary basins. The petroliferous (petroleum containing) Canterbury basin of New Zealand is a classic example, where saucer-shaped magmatic sills are embedded within the Cretaceous to Eocene (geological period that lasted from about 145 to 33.9 million years ago) succession resulting into forced folds and

hydrothermal vents above the sill terminations. (Read more)

Pierre Gasly secured a maiden Formula One triumph on Sunday when he won a tumultuous Italian Grand Prix for the Alpha Tauri team after crashes, penalties and safety cars had tipped expectations

upside down at Monza.



The first French race winner in 24 years seized his opportunity and resisted late pressure from Carlos Sainz of McLaren to claim his team's second victory with Lance Stroll finishing third for Racing Point. (Read more)

Menzel's wife, Olga, announced his death late Sunday, saying he died the previous day. No details were given. Three years ago, Menzel underwent a brain operation and was kept in an artificially induced coma for several weeks after it. (Read more)

Who: At 96.2%, Kerala

What: tops India's literacy rate chart again, Andhra ranks last at 66.4%

When: published on 7th September 2020

With 96.2 per cent literacy, Kerala has once again emerged as the most literate state in the country, while Andhra Pradesh featured at the bottom with a rate of 66.4 per cent, showed a report based on National Statistical Office (NSO) survey.

The report on 'Household Social Consumption: Education in India as part of 75th round of National Sample Survey – from July 2017 to June 2018' provides for state-wise detail of literacy rate among the persons aged seven years and above.



According to the study, after Kerala, Delhi has the best literacy rate at 88.7 per cent, followed by Uttarkhand's 87.6 per cent, Himachal Pradesh's 86.6 per cent and Assam's at 85.9 per cent.

On the other hand, Rajasthan is the second worst performer with literacy rate at 69.7 per cent, followed by Bihar at 70.9 per cent, Telangana at 72.8 per cent, Uttar Pradesh at 73 per cent and Madhya Pradesh at 73.7 per cent. (Read more)

Hyderabad is one of the top five cities in the country to offer jobs in the field of artificial intelligence (AI), a latest report by job portal site Indeed has revealed.

Bengaluru tops the list of destinations for a career in AI, followed by Mumbai, Hyderabad, Pune, and Chennai. Job searches in the field have risen 106 per cent in the past year (June 2019 to June 2020), and this has increased further by 20 per cent from March to July 2020, in line with the onset of the pandemic.

Al-related job postings have also seen a steady rise in the last two years, with a 51 per cent jump between June 2019 and June 2020. (Read more)

Basic facts that you must know about BRICS:

BRICS is an acronym for the grouping of the world's leading emerging economies, namely Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa.

In 2001, the British Economist Jim O'Neill coined the term BRIC to describe the four emerging economies of Brazil, Russia, India, and China.

The grouping was formalised during the first meeting of BRIC Foreign Ministers in 2006.

South Africa was invited to join BRIC in December 2010, after which the group adopted the acronym BRICS.
