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Explanation:

1. The sentence starts with 'it' and we need a verb which must be either in third form or in first form but in singular. Going through all the bolded words, only '**agreed**' can fit at first place in both ways, grammatically and contextually.

So, the first two letters of the sequence must be 'BA'. The phrase 'exam would' demands a verb or a helping verb and '**have**' is a helping verb and this ensures that the sequence must remain in original form in the second half portion of the sequence. The correct sequence comes to be '**BACD**'.

Evidently, option C is the correct answer.

2. There is no need to rearrange any word from their already positioned places as they are contextually and grammatically correct by all means.

Thus, option E is the correct answer.

3. The phrase 'many **bolster**' is grammatically and contextually incorrect and demands a replacement. We need a verb here and '**feared**' is one of the verbs which can fit into the context easily and this means 'B' must come at the first position in the final sequence. Out of given all options, only 'option B' has 'B' at desired place.

Furthermore, the phrase 'comments at the **presidential** debate' makes more sense than 'comments at the **bolster** debate' or 'comments at the **like** debate'. Putting 'D' at second position and **bolster** at third, the complete sequence of option B becomes valid.

Evidently, option B is the correct answer.

4. The phrase 'an **time**' requires a noun and this makes a replacement of 'A' with 'D' as 'D' fulfils the requirement. Besides, 'time for **those** who have been **waiting**' seems more logical than 'time for **waiting** who have been **those**' and this makes the final sequence to be DCBA.

Evidently, option C is the correct answer.

5. The phrase “In July this **subjects**” does not make any sense and only “**year**” is a word which can come at first position and makes a proper sense as “In July this **year**” seems logical. The possibility of all other options can be ruled out here as only ‘option D’ starts with ‘C’ as the first letter in the sequence.

So, ‘A’ and ‘C’ can be interchanged with each other making ‘C’ to be the first letter and ‘A’ to be the third letter of the sequence.

Besides, the phrase “due to the **announced** caused” is logically incorrect as it makes no logical sense, so this must be interchanged with ‘B’ as it would appear like ‘due to the **disruption** caused’ and makes more sense.

Evidently, option D is the correct answer.

6. The phrase ‘brain **footsteps**’ is absurd whereas ‘father’s **footsteps**’ seems more logical and this makes the replacement of ‘B’ with ‘C’ making ‘C’ to be the second and ‘B’ to be the third letter in the sequence. Going through all options provided, only ‘option A’ has both the letters at their correct places.

Besides, ‘career in **passing**’ makes no sense and this can be replaced by ‘**politics**’ and the final outcome must be in sequence as **DCBA**.

Evidently, option A is the correct answer.

7. The phrase ‘sweeps **oxygen** the country’ doesn’t make any proper sense. Therefore, we need to replace ‘A’ with ‘D’ as ‘sweeps **across** the country’ is correct by all means and the rest two are placed at their correct places and need not any changes.

Thus, option D is the correct answer.

8. Looking at ‘A’ and ‘B’ ‘Years of **clashes**’ sounds more genuine than ‘Years of **between**’ as after ‘of’ we need a plural noun which is **clashes**. So, ‘B’ and ‘A’ should interchange their original places and rest two letters are correctly placed and need not any changes.

Evidently, option A is the correct answer.

9. The phrase 'The **basic**' is grammatically and contextually and needs a noun after article 'the' and the only word which can suit our requirement is **technology** and this means 'A' must be replaced with 'B' and the sequence must become '**BA**' initially.

Besides, the phrase 'will **experiencing**' is grammatically incorrect and this needs a replacement with '**require**'. This gives the final sequence to be **BADC**.

Evidently, option B is the correct answer.

10. The phrase 'They were **condolences**' doesn't make any proper sense as we need a verb in continuous form here. So, we need to replace 'A' with 'D' as 'They were **hoping**' is correct by all means and the rest two are placed at their correct places and need not any changes.

Thus, option D is the correct answer.



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
