Option A: *Slowing* is opposite to the correct meaning and is incorrect.

Option C: *Shouting* does not make sense as the first word. The other twowords also do not make sense in the statement due to being incorrect in terms of meaning.

Option D: Assuaged means relieved and does not fit in contextually. Also, overlooked is opposite of the correct meaning.

Option B: All the words fit in well.

Hence, option B is correct.

2. The original set of words is incorrect due to use of *special* which should have been *especially*.

Option A: All the words are incorrect and do not fit in.

Option B: Only *belonging* fits as the third word. *Thought* is very general while *peculiar;* meaning *strange,* is incorrect in terms of meaning.

Option D: Both heed and relevant are incorrect.

Option C: All the words fit in well.
