1. The original sentence is incorrect. A *disease* cannot be described as *stern*. Also, *improving stress levels* is the opposite of what is needed here. *Like* also does not make any sense.

Option A: *Static* and *Impending (something about to happen)* do not go with the context.

Option B: The words are correct in the context

Option C: All the words are irrelevant. *Implode* means to collapse or cause to collapse violently inwards.

Option D: All the words are incorrect. *Improvising* means to create spontaneously or without preparation.

<u>Correct:</u> Insomnia is becoming a very **serious** disease these days because of the **increasing** levels of stress among the young generation due to **lack** of employment opportunities.

Hence, Option B is the correct choice.

2. The original sentence is not correct since the highlighted words are not making sense as a coherent sentence.

Option A: All the words are incorrect. Adduce refers *to cite something as evidence* and does not fit in meaningfully.

Option B: *Imply* and *Attrition* (reducing something's strength) are not correct in the present context Option C: All the words are correct. *Averse* refers to *being against something*. Option D: *Accustom* and *antiquity* are not correct.

<u>Correct:</u> He was not at all ready to accept that his father was no more although he was all averse to his advice regarding any matter during his lifetime.

So, Option C is the correct choice.

3. The original statement is incorrect as the none of the words make sense and render the statement meaningless.

Option A: *Extolled* means *to praise enthusiastically and* is the opposite of what is needed here. Option B: *Of* and *traded* both are incorrect. Option D: *Scored* is incorrect as the third word here. Option C: All the words are a perfect fit in the statement.

<u>Correct</u>: Economic reforms need to break the grip of **stigmatized** capitalism through more competitive markets, a reinstated fundamental right to property, greater reliance **on** rules rather than discretion, and a change in the way government contracts are **awarded**.

Hence, option C is correct.

4. The original statement is incorrect as the none of the words make sense and render the statement meaningless.

Option A: *Registration* is wrong here.

Option B: *Leisurely* is incorrect here.

Option C: *Monumental* is wrong here.

Option D: All the words are a perfect fit in the statement.

<u>Correct</u>: The implementation must begin at the back end, with incentives and tax benefits that could aid manufacturers in their gradual shift to alternatives for plastic.

Hence, option D is correct.

5. The original statement is incorrect as the none of the words make sense and render the statement meaningless.

Option A: Setting is incorrect.

Option B: *Picture* and *period* both are incorrect.

Option C: Terrain and managed both are incorrect.

Option D: All the words are a perfect fit in the statement.

<u>Correct</u>: The global start-up landscape is still dominated by the West, though a discernible shift is underway.

Hence, option D is correct.

6. The sentence is incorrect since the highlighted words are not making sense at all and at the same time, they are not grammatically correct as well.

Option A: All the given options are wrong Option B: None of the words is correct Option C: All the given words are correct Option D: No word is correct

<u>Correct:</u> It is highly unlikely that India will be able to compete with China in terms of nuclear weapons as China has developed many advanced weapons thanks to the astounding success of technology in that country.
