Explanations:

1. If we go through the given sentence we can see that none of the bold words can replace each other since none of them is synonymous in meaning to each other. Therefore it will never be possible replace these words and form a meaningful sentence. Even without that, if we look at the given options also, none of them will be able to form a meaningful sentence again, albeit with a different meaning.

Therefore, Option E is the correct choice among the given options.

2. A and D can be interchanged among the given options since *improve* and *enhance* both point at the same thing here i.e. the government wants to increase investments in the manufacturing sector so that this sector gets developed whereas the other target is to increase the farm income of the farming community so that the primary sector is also developed in the process.

No other pair can be interchanged to form a meaningful sentence.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.

3. There is no pair of words that can be interchanged with each other to form a meaningful sentence.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.

4. Here the sentence is correct grammatically in the present form and there is no change required here to make it grammatically and contextually correct.

This makes Option E the correct choice among the given options.

5. A and B can be interchanged since we can use *central* and *state* interchangeably and that will still be a meaningful sentence. No other word can be interchanged in order to form a meaningful sentence.

This makes Option D the correct choice among the given options.
