1. Boisterous (Adj.): *Noisy and mischievous*

Synonyms: Clamorous, rowdy, raucous, rambunctious

Antonyms: Calm, placid, moderate, quiet, solemn

Hence we can see that clamorous and placid will give us the pair that provides us the combination of the synonym and the antonym of the given word. Adversity means some problem whereas aspersion refers to verbal exhibition of bad temper, captivating implies enthralling or entertaining. Desist means refrain from doing something.

This makes Option D the correct choice among the given options.

2. Contrary (Adj.): *Antagonistic or opposite*

Synonyms: Adverse, antithetical, conflicting, dissimilar

Antonyms: Similar, consistent, agreeable, friendly

Therefore we can see that *dissimilar* and *conflicting* both are similar in meaning to the word given in bold and that is why the pair with these two words will be our pick. Coming to the other given words, *blunt* means *dull* or insensitive whereas evasive implies deceitful or tricky. Earthly and fleshly both are similar in meaning and that mean *carnal*. Generic and liberal both mean *catholic*.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.

3. Decipher (Verb): Figure out or understand something

Synonyms: Interpret, decode, deduce, solve, translate

Antonyms: Misinterpret, distort, confuse, conceal

Therefore we can see that both interpret and distort are related to the word given in bold since the first one is similar in meaning whereas the second one is the opposite in meaning. Therefore we get required of words with the and the our pair synonym antonym. Introvert means reserved whereas intentional implies deliberate and mocking and taunting are synonyms to each other implying deriding or making fun of somebody or something. Rash and sudden can also be used as antonyms of the word deliberate.

This makes Option B the correct choice among the given options.

4. Efface (Verb): Erase something or make one insignificant or inconspicuous

Synonyms: Destroy, obliterate, eliminate, exterminate, terminate

Antonyms: Retain, maintain, build, construct, produce, create

We can see that the pair of words that will come in handy in this case will be *destroy* and *obliterate* as both these words are similar in meaning to the given word in bold. *Undertake* and *aspire* both imply *endeavour to do something* whereas *demur* means *disagree or hesitate*.

This makes Option A the correct choice among the given options.

5. Forsake (Verb): abandon or leave something or somebody

Synonyms: Desert, abandon, leave, renounce

Antonyms: Hold, maintain, Keep

Therefore both *desert* and *renounce* can be used as the synonyms of the given word and this is our required pair here. Coming to the other words, *converge and huddle* both imply *gather around something. Hatred and grudge* both are similar in meaning since they both imply *aversion against something or somebody. Retard* implies *delay or hold back something* and *prevent* also implies *to stop something.*

This makes Option A the correct choice among the given options.

6. Acumen (Noun): The ability to make good judgments and take quick decisions

Synonyms: Awareness, Shrewdness, acuity, sharpness

Antonyms: Stupidity, ignorance

Among the other words, abrogate refers to abolish something whereas aggravate means to increase something especially some pain. Vain refers to being unproductive.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.

7. Audacity (Noun): A willingness to take bold risks / being disrespectful or rude to others

Synonyms: Boldness, daring, bravery, presumption, insolence

Antonyms: Cowardice, mildness, submissiveness,

Among the other words, *brittle* means *easily breakable* whereas *astound* means *baffled* whereas the word *faze* is also similar in meaning.

This makes Option A the correct choice among the given options.

8. Baroque (Adj.): Highly ornate and extravagant in style

Synonyms: Florid, gilt, ostentatious, fancy

Antonyms: Unadorned, simple, plain

Among the other given words, desolate means barren or sterile whereas batty means insane. Erotic and coarse are similar in meaning implying immoral in nature.

This makes Option B the correct choice among the given options.

9. Chastise (Verb): *Rebuke or reprimand severely*

Synonyms: Punish, admonish, berate, scold, chide, reprove

Antonyms: Appreciate, praise, approve

Among the other words, conspicuous and prominent are similar in meaning.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.

10. Deceit (Noun): *The* action or practice of deceiving someone by concealing or misrepresenting the truth

Synonyms: Deception, artifice, duplicity, fraud

Antonyms: Veracity, sincerity, genuineness

Among the other given options, *naïve* means showing lack of experience or judgment.

Contamination refers to polluting something whereas ratification refers to conforming something officially.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.
