The iron industry in England took off after 1760 since iron ore and coal were both plentiful in England. Abraham Derby, in 1709, inverted a way of somelting iron using coke so good quality iron got available in England in 18th century. Before this, it was imported from other countries.

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Ignatius Loyola along with six others formed 'company of Jesus' in 1534, which later came to known as the society of Jesus. Jesuits work in education, intellectual research and cultural pursuits.
